





Volunteers engage in activities including Nativity Prep Academy, Bethany House, St. Anne's Nursing Home, St. Joe's House of Hospitality, The Boys and Girls Club, and Mercy Spirituality Center to uplift those in need. This year we provided CASE Training (Creating A Safe Environment) through the Diocese of Rochester for 50 students who want to volunteer with Newman, through Tiger Crossways. Through their volunteer work, they have touched the lives of many individuals and organizations.

The grant will pave the way for the creation of the inspiring "Tiger's Crossways" project. This initiative aims to bring together RIT students and young individuals from the City of Rochester in a mentoring relationship, fostering connections and bridging the gap between various communities. This remarkable acknowledgment highlights our commitment to our Catholic faith and the biblical vision of justice and peace shared by the Basilian Fathers.


